QUILTS FOR ORPHAN GRAIN TRAIN—MICHIGAN

Many Women's Quilting Groups across the church may have recently learned Covid-19 is keeping them from contributing guilts where they previously have done so. Nevertheless, quilters have a very viable option. Orphan Grain Train—Michigan located in Sebewaing continues to receive and distribute quilts, blankets, clothing, and medical equipment without restriction. Far from being constrained, Orphan Grain Train remains busy processing donated goods for distribution. Quilts are among the most appreciated items from caring women who devote great effort making them. In February an international shipment from the OGT-M Center in Sebewaing arrived in Kyrgyzstan to benefit struggling people just as the pandemic hit that region of Asia. The Michigan warehouse of Orphan Grain Train is now being stocked for further Christian humanitarian aid world-wide. Another shipment is planned for this autumn likely to Central America.
