- 4. Do I firmly believe that Jesus gives His actual body and blood to me in this sacrament?
- 5. Do I expect to receive God's gift of forgiveness through this meal?
- 6. Do I sincerely intend, with the help of God, not to return to a life of sin but to live to Jesus' glory?

All who have been instructed about the meaning of communion in the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod and who confess these statements of belief are welcome to receive communion.
